



VILLAGE OF CORRALES

RESOLUTION NO. 14- 60

A RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE CARE OF ANIMALS IMPOUNDED BY AND AVAILABLE FOR ADOPTION FROM THE VILLAGE OF CORRALES; AUTHORIZING THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE VILLAGE TO NEGOTIATE A LEASE FOR APPROPRIATE COMMERCIAL SPACE FOR AN ANIMAL ADOPTION CENTER TO FACILITATE THE EARLY ADOPTION OF ANIMALS IN THE VILLAGE'S CARE; PROVIDING THAT FUNDS WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR THE LEASE OF SUCH SPACE.

WHEREAS, the Corrales No Kill Animal Shelter and Adoption Center Task Force (the "Task Force") has assessed the current situation regarding the ability of the Village of Corrales (the "Village") to find homes for animals that are in the care of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force solicited information for and developed a comprehensive needs assessment that included outreach and input from all interested persons and parties in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force's priority recommendation is for the Village to establish an adoption center open to the public as a strategy to shorten the time that animals are under the care of the Village before a suitable home is found for them; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council, the governing body of the Village, strongly opposes and prohibits the euthanizing of healthy animals in the care of the Village, as reflected in Ordinance No. 11-011 adopted on May 24, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Village of Corrales, New Mexico, that:

1. There is hereby created a Phase II Adoption Center Task Force consisting of five (5) members, to be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Governing Body, to provide advice and assistance to the Village relating to the operation of an adoption center for animals in the custody of the Village. The Phase II Adoption Center Task Force shall continue in existence for a period of two (2) years from the date of adoption of this Resolution, unless extended for a further period by resolution of the Governing Body. The Phase II Adoption Center Task force shall be governed by the provisions of Ordinance No. 167, adopted on March 23, 1987 (Village Code, Sections 2-134 through 2-136, inclusive).


2. The Governing Body requests that the Village administration, with the advice and assistance of the Phase II Adoption Center Task Force, seek out appropriate

store-front or other publicly visible commercial space for an animal adoption center to be located in or near the Village.

3. The Village administration is further authorized to negotiate a commercially reasonable lease for any proposed space identified for the animal adoption center, based on sound business principles and in consultation with the Phase II Adoption Center Task Force, and to present the proposed lease for consideration by the Governing Body at the earliest reasonable opportunity.


